







# Six Syllable Types

Closed		<b>Closed Syllable:</b> The syllable ends in one vowel and one or more consonants. The vowel sound is short. <b>at pot egg hitch</b>
VCe		<b>Vowel-Consonant-e (VCe):</b> A syllable ending in one vowel, one consonant and silent e, with the Silent "e" making the vowel say its name, that is, making it long. A few words have two consonants between the vowels. <b>cake like tune clothe</b>
R-Controlled		<b>R-Controlled Syllables:</b> These syllables consist of at least one vowel followed by an "r". The "r" modifies the vowel(s). Most obvious with short vowels. <b>car horn fern bird</b>
Vowel Team		<b>Vowel Combination (vowel teams):</b> Here two vowels make one sound or one vowel combines with one or more consonants to make one sound. <b>team coin snow high</b>
Open		<b>Open syllable :</b> A syllable is open if it ends in one vowel. The vowel sound is long (says its name). <b>me hi yoyo baby</b>
-Cle		<b>Consonant-l-e (Cle):</b> This is a final syllable ending in a Silent e. <b>table puzzle turtle eagle</b>
